The vast majority of adoptions by sole males are step-parents adopting the children of their spouse or partner. However, from our adoption data we can provide the number of adoptions by sole males where the child was of no relation to them. These numbers are shown below:

Since the introduction of the Adoption of Children Act 1926 and the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act 1930 there has been provision within the law for adoption by single men.

Current adoption law in Scotland is set out in the Adoption and Children (Scotland) Act 2007 and section 30 sets out eligibility for adoption by one person.

We do not have information on sexual orientation of adopters. This is a formal notice under section 17(1) of FOISA that National Records of Scotland does not have some of the information requested.
