Letter from Private Andrew McNulty, 16th Battalion Royal Scots, to his aunt Miss Kate McNulty, 20 October 1915. NRS, SC70/8/415/77

October 20th 1915

Dear Kate

In the will which I have handed over to the Gover[n]ment I left all my belongings to you. But I wish that the following bequests be carried out.

In the first place, my watch, which I received from my Aunt Rose, shall be given to my niece Rose Mary McNulty; my cigarette case to my nephew Charles McNulty; my watch chain to my cousin Joseph McNulty; my fountain pen to my cousin Jeremiah Oswald McNulty. My pocket book to my brother George and my books, papers & such things shall be given to my Uncle Frank McNulty. There is my Independent Labour Party badge which you shall send to my friend John Farley Junior, Addiewell.

I don't think there is anything more I can think about, but you will ask all my friends to think of me at my best, to remember the good of me, and forget the bad. To sometimes remember to say a little prayer for me. I wish also to thank you all for all you have done for me. And trust that the McNultys may long live, as they have always done, in peace & harmony with each other.

In conclusion I would ask that on the 15th of January every year, you will have Holy Mass offered for the repose of the soul of her who was more than a mother to me, Rose McNulty
