The County of Lanark: that the deponent knows of no Testamentary Settlement or other Writing left by the deceased relative to the disposal of his personal Estate and Effects or any other part thereof: that the forgoing Inventory signed by the Deponent and the said Justice of the Peace as relative hereto is a full and complete Inventory of the Personal Estate and Effects of the Said deceased David Livingstone wheresoever situated and belonging or due to him beneficially at the time of his death in so far as the same has come to the deponents Knowledge: that the Deponent does not know of any money or property belonging to the deceased liable to the duty imposed by the Acts 23 vict C15 and C3 &
