1. Introduction

Following on from the previous paper PAMS(09) 19 it would be useful to get an agreement in principle from PAMS members on the outputs that should be revised after the 2011 Census. In the event of insufficient resource to carry out all revisions it would also be useful to get an idea of the priority for which outputs to revise. 2. List of outputs that should be revised in suggested order of priority

- Mid-year estimates for council and NHS board areas, 2001 to 2010
- Net migration estimates for Scotland, council and NHS board areas Small Area Population Estimates (datazones), 2001 to 2010
- Nomenclature of Units for Territorial Statistics (NUTS) population estimates, 2001 to 2010
- Life expectancy estimates, 2001 to 2010 for council and NHS board areas only
- Marital Status Estimates, 2001 to 2010

3. List of outputs it is not intended to revise

- National and Sub-national population projections (council and NHS board areas, Strategic Development Plan Areas (SDPA) and National Park (NP) areas)
- Population estimates for special populations and areas e.g. estimates by Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD), Urban Rural, Westminster Parliamentary Constituencies, Settlements and Localities
- Sub-Scotland level life expectancy estimates excluding council and NHS board area estimates e.g. Community Health Partnership areas.

4. Potential outputs to revise?

- Should we revise in and out flows and rest of UK and overseas flows? What priority should this have?
