## **Beyond 2011 Stakeholder Engagement Work**

### **Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA)**

1. A wide-scale PIA for the Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland is currently being drafted and is being updated following advice from legal experts and data custodians. This is an internal document but there will be a public facing document created once the PIA has been approved.

### **Equality Impact Assessment**

1. Work has started on producing an Equalities Impact Assessment for the Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland; this is being combined with our engagement with Equality Groups and results from the first consultation. It is planned that work on equality specific issues will continue through 2013.

### **Website Activity**

1. The [Beyond 2011](#) portal within the current GROS (NRS) website has been redeveloped. There is now a dedicated stakeholder engagement section on the website, which holds papers, minutes etc from all our engagement activities.
2. The website is continually in review to reflect updates to our research as well as research undertaken by Office for National Statistics (ONS).
3. Work is ongoing looking at the Beyond 2011 glossary, which we hope can be standardised across the UK, ensuring that the same terminology is used across all administrations.
4. A stakeholder engagement plan has been developed, which details the work that will be taken forward between now and the Ministerial options paper and the draft business case. A [public facing stakeholder engagement plan](#) has been approved and has been published on the NRS Beyond 2011 portal.

### **Beyond 2011 Newsletter**

1. A [Beyond 2011 newsletter](#) has been created, which will be distributed and published on the NRS website on an ongoing basis. The first issue should be live within the next few weeks.

### **Knowledge Hub**

1. The Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland now has a presence on the Local Government Association's [Knowledge Hub](#). We will be posting details here of our publications, events, consultations etc as well as hoping to engage members of the community in the dedicated forum pages:

## Stakeholder Engagement Events

1. A series of stakeholder engagement sessions on the topic of user requirements for producing population and socio-demographic statistics have been held across Scotland, including discussions with genealogists, local authorities, health boards, academics, equality groups and specialist interest groups.
2. These began on the 8<sup>th</sup> November 2012 and finished in March 2013. The write-ups from these events are now being published within the [Consultation and Events](#) section of the NRS website. It is hoped that they will all be published by the end of April 2013.

## Formal Consultation Launches

1. The first of our consultations, on user requirements, launched on the 18<sup>th</sup> March and will run until 10<sup>th</sup> June. It is hoped that the results from this will be published within the [Consultation and Events](#) section of the NRS website early autumn. (This is primarily expected to be completed online).
2. The Scottish Data Sharing and Linkage Service consultation, around the structure of the Service, is now live and can be found on the [Data Sharing and Linkage](#) page of the Information Services Division (ISD) website.

## Future Stakeholder Engagement Events

1. We are planning a series of stakeholder engagement sessions concerning privacy issues and views on the emerging options for the Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland.
2. We would hope to combine these events into full day events by combining our engagement work with the Data Sharing and Linkage Service work and the emerging benefits realisation work for the 2011 Census.
3. These are expected to commence in Autumn 2013.
