<b>2011.7</b>	Consider whether it is possible to publish basic household information with the first data release	<b>Sandy Taylor and Thomas Robertson</b>	Complete. It is the intention to publish the census count of the number of households in each local authority as part of the first release.
<b>2011.8</b>	Investigate the production of an exact fit of census output areas to national park boundaries.	<b>Sandy Taylor</b>	Complete. A true exact fit to National Park (NP) boundaries is not possible from our underlying set of postcode boundaries but will aim to align the boundaries output areas (which are built up from groups of postcodes) with NP boundaries as best we can.
