Beyond 2011 Stakeholder Engagement Work

Privacy Impact Assessment (PIA)

1. A wide-scale PIA for the Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland has been created and National Records of Scotland (NRS) have shared this document with Glasgow City Council as part of the Population Estimates Comparison Project. There are plans to share this with a small group of organisations (including the Information Commissioners Office) to further develop the PIA.
2. We will also be engaging directly with privacy groups over the coming months to further develop the PIA and to ensure that we address any concerns they may have on our Beyond 2011.

Knowledge Hub

4. The Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland has a continuing presence on the Knowledge Hub. We will be posting details here of our publications, events, consultations etc as well as hoping to engage members of the community in the dedicated forum pages on knowledgehub.local.gov.uk website
5. The future of the Knowledge Hub seems to be resolved and there are no immediate plans to close the site down.
6. There is a new Community Planning Partnerships (CPP) site on the Knowledge Hub which has been set-up to work with Census 2011 users. This group is intended to be a location for knowledge-sharing between CPP and other related bodies with regard to the 2011 Census, this is being facilitated by the Scottish Government via the knowledgehub.local.gov.uk website

Formal Consultation

7. The first of our consultations, on user requirements, closed on the 10th June 2013. It is hoped that the results from this will be published online early autumn. This had a good response rate of 125, a mixture of individuals and organisations.
8. We will be engaging further with respondents to the consultation to gather more detailed evidence, especially around the justification of small area statistics.

Office for National Statistics (ONS) Consultation

9. ONS launched their public consultation on "[The Census and future provision of population statistics in England and Wales](#)" on the 23rd September 2013 on their website. The consultation will run for 12 weeks to 13th December 2013.

Stakeholder Engagement Events

10. A series of stakeholder engagement sessions on the topic of user requirements for producing population and socio-demographic statistics have been held across Scotland, including discussions with genealogists, local authorities, health boards, academics, equality groups and specialist interest groups. These have now all been published online and their findings will be included in the consultation report.

Future Stakeholder Engagement Events

11. We are planning a series of stakeholder engagement sessions concerning privacy issues around the emerging options for the Beyond 2011 programme in Scotland.
12. We are hosting two specific public events as part of the Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) Festival of Social Science. More details can be found on our Knowledge Hub site.
