Population¹

The 2015 population for Glasgow City is 606,340; an increase of 1.1 per cent from 599,640 in 2014. The population of Glasgow City accounts for 11.3 per cent of the total population of Scotland.

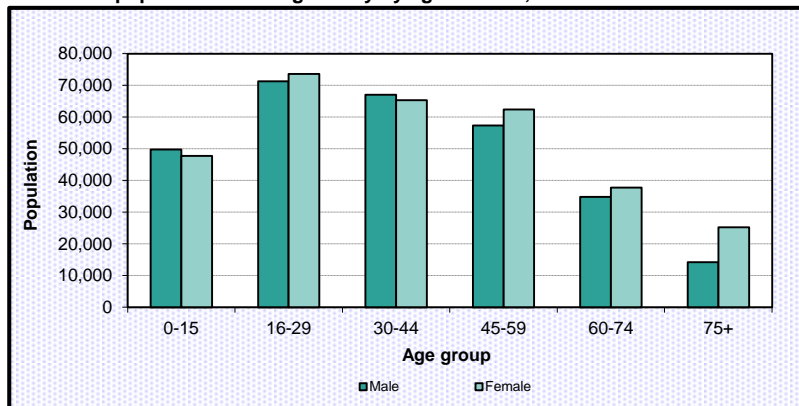
In Glasgow City, 23.9 per cent of the population are aged 16 to 29 years. This is larger than Scotland where 18.2 per cent are aged 16 to 29 years. Persons aged 60 and over make up 18.5 per cent of Glasgow City. This is smaller than Scotland where 24.2 per cent are aged 60 and over.

Since 1989, Glasgow City's total population has fallen overall. Scotland's population has risen over this period.

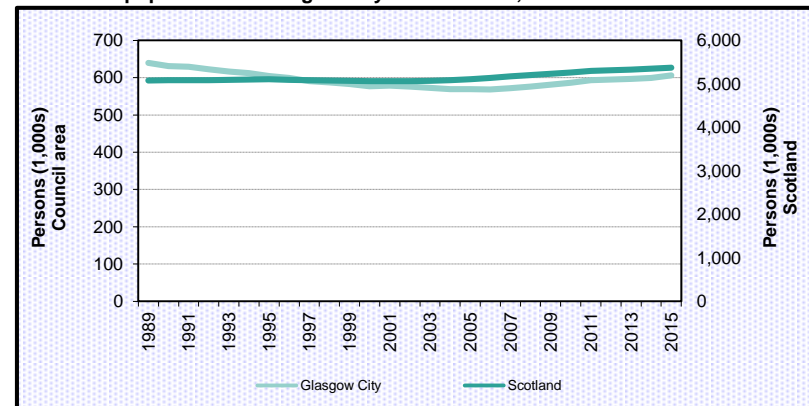

Births² (calendar year)

Between 2013 and 2014 Glasgow City experienced a 2.9 per cent increase in the number of births, rising from 7,254 in 2013, to 7,465 in 2014. The number of births in Scotland rose by 1.3 per cent.

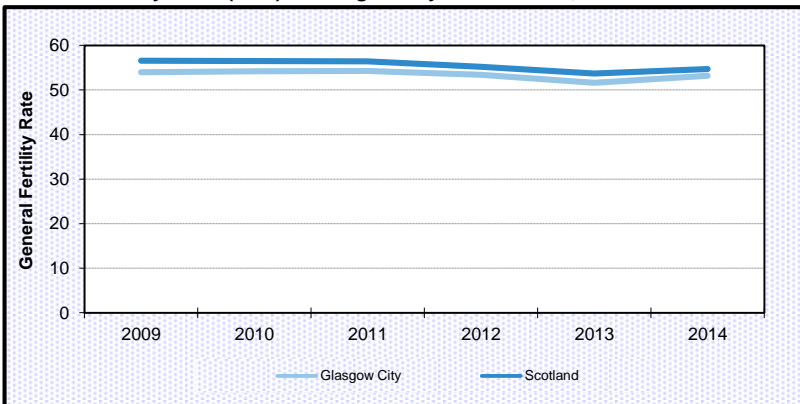
The most popular name given to boys born in Glasgow City in 2015 was Muhammad and the most popular name given to girls was Sophie.

Fertility in Glasgow City increased from 51.6 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2013, to 53.2 in 2014. For Scotland as a whole, the general fertility rate increased from 53.7 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2013, to 54.7 in 2014.

General Fertility Rate* (GFR) in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2009-2014

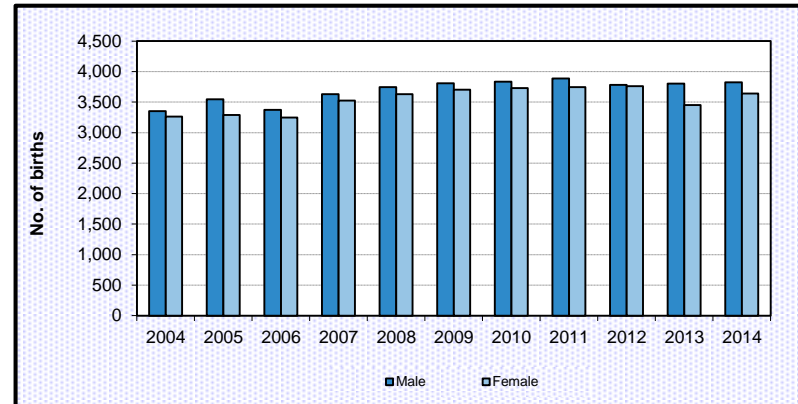

Live births by sex, Glasgow City, 2004-2014



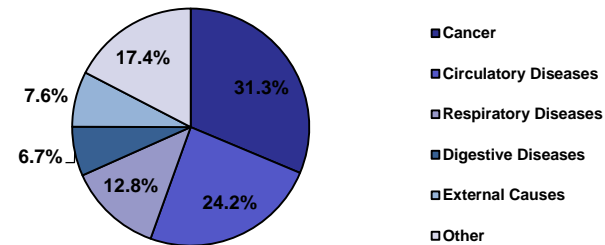
Deaths³ (calendar year)

The number of deaths in Glasgow City decreased from 6,305 in 2013 to 6,205 in 2014. Over the period 2012 to 2014 the overall death rate was higher for males than for females. Compared to Scotland over the period 2012 to 2014, Glasgow City had a higher death rate. The main cause of death in Glasgow City was cancer, followed by circulatory disease.

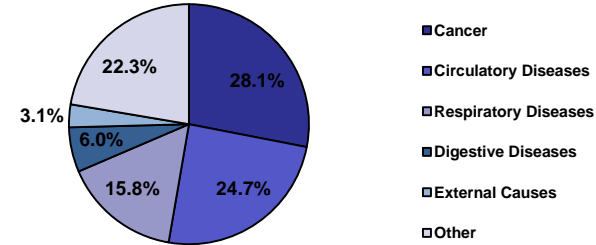

Migration⁴

On average in 2012-14 there was a net outflow of 17 people from Glasgow City per year, meaning that less people entered Glasgow City (27,259 per year) than left (27,276 per year). The 16 to 29 year olds age group accounted for the largest group of in-migrants into Glasgow City. The largest group of out-migrants was also the 16 to 29 year olds.

Life Expectancy

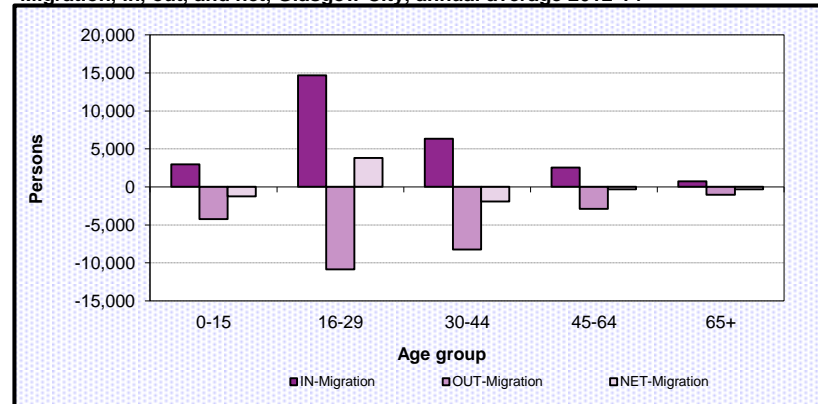
Female life expectancy at birth (78.7 years) is greater than male life expectancy (73.4 years), but both were lower than the Scottish average. Male life expectancy at birth in Glasgow City is improving more rapidly than female life expectancy.

In Glasgow City female life expectancy at age 65 (18.1 years) is greater than male life expectancy at age 65 (15.2 years).

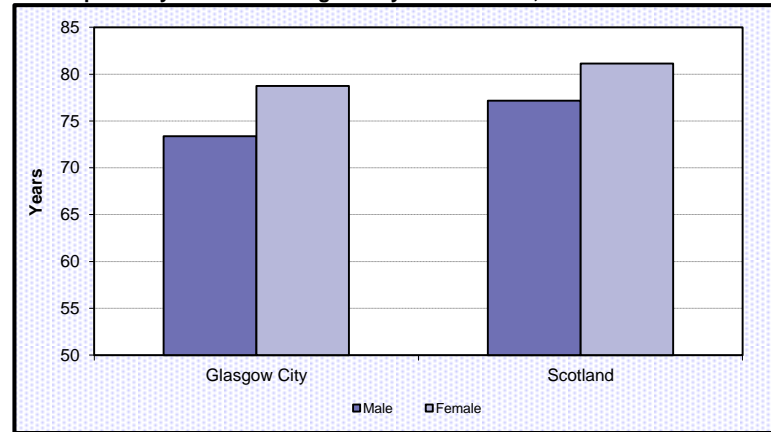

Life expectancy at birth in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2012-2014



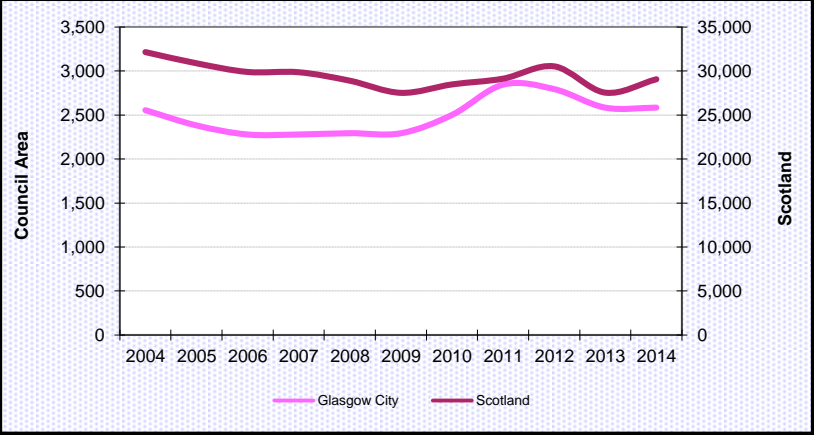
Marriages & Civil Partnerships

There were 2,584 marriages in Glasgow City in 2014; no change from 2013.
 In Glasgow City 55.4 per cent of people marrying in 2014 were aged 25-34. In Scotland as a whole 48.6 per cent of people marrying were in this age group.
 Since 2004 the number of marriages in Glasgow City has risen by 1.1 per cent.
 Scotland has seen an increase during the same period of time.

Population Projections

By 2037 the population of Glasgow City is projected to be 684,744, an increase of 15.1 per cent compared to the population in 2012. The population of Scotland is projected to increase by 8.8 per cent between 2012 and 2037.

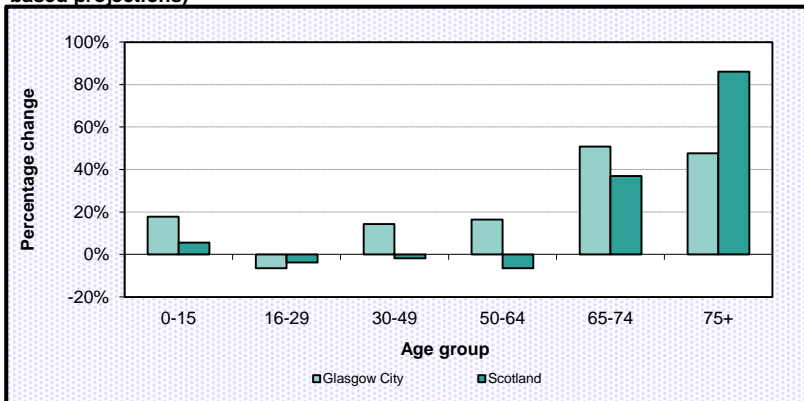
Over the 25 year period, the age group that is projected to increase the most in size in Glasgow City is the 65-74 age group. This is in contrast to Scotland, where the 75+ year old age group is projected to increase the most.

The population aged under 16 in Glasgow City is projected to increase by 17.7 per cent over the 25 year period.

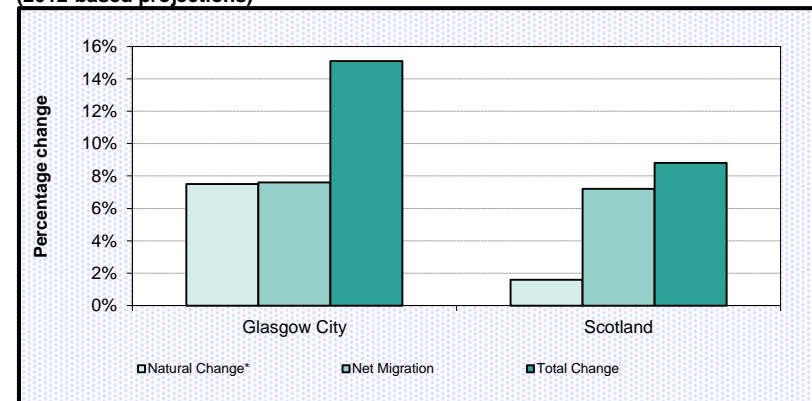

Households & Dwellings

The 2015 estimate of the number of households in Glasgow City is 290,694. This is a 0.9 per cent increase in the 2014 figure of 288,137, compared to a 0.6 per cent increase in Scotland as a whole. The proportion of these households receiving a single adult Council Tax discount is 45.3 per cent. For Scotland, this figure is 37.4 per cent.

With regards to the dwellings in Glasgow City, 97 per cent are occupied, 3 per cent are vacant and 0 per cent are second homes. The proportions of dwellings in Scotland which are vacant and second homes are 3.1 per cent and 1.1 per cent, respectively.

The 2015 estimate of the number of dwellings in Glasgow City is 304,013. This is an increase of 0.7 per cent from 2014 and compares to a 0.7 per cent increase across Scotland as a whole.

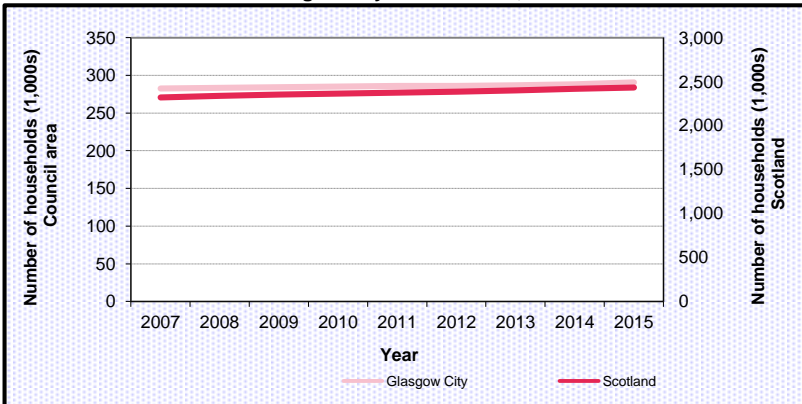

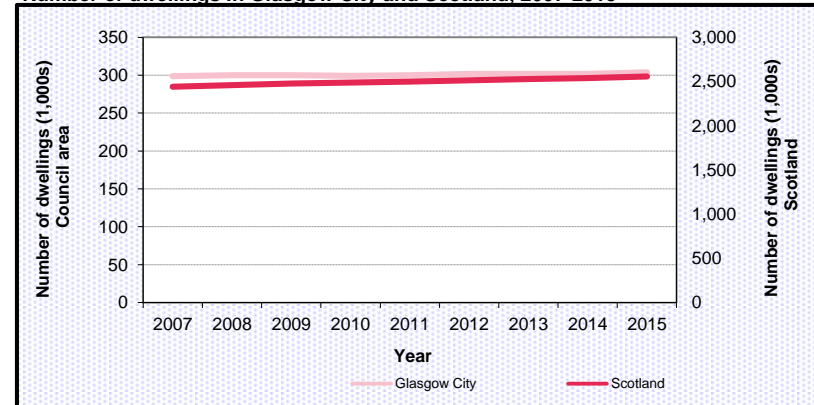

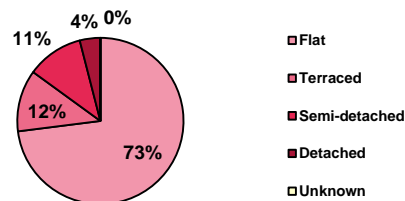
Number of households in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2007-2015



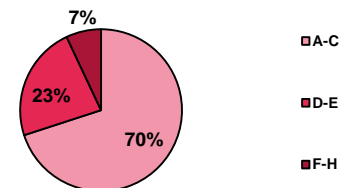
Number of dwellings in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2007-2015

Proportions of dwellings by Council Tax band in Glasgow City, 2015



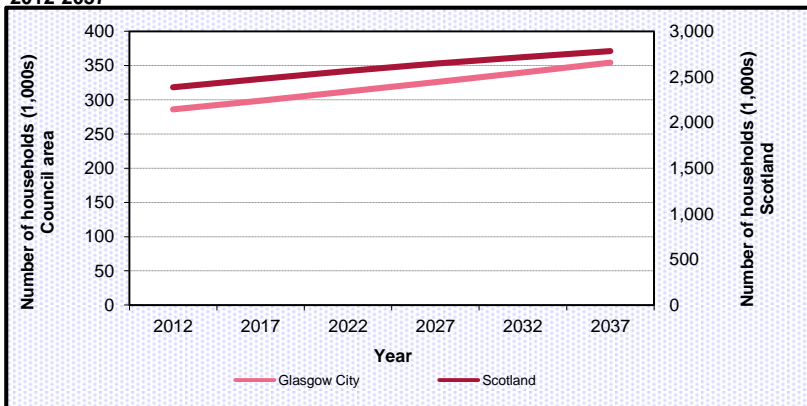
Household Projections

The total number of households in Glasgow City is projected to change from 286,134 in 2012 to 354,006 in 2037, which is an increase of 24 per cent. In Scotland as a whole, the projected number of households is set to increase by 17 per cent over the same 25 year period.

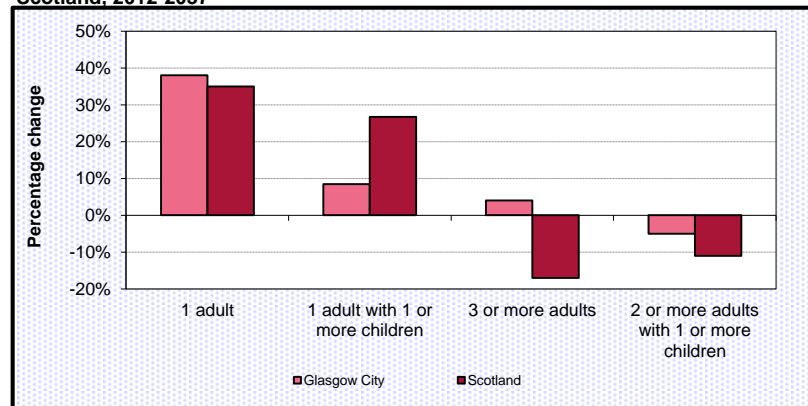
In Scotland, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 35 per cent over the 25 year period. In Glasgow City, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 38 per cent, and the number of larger households in Glasgow City is projected to fall, with the number of households of 2 or more adults with children decreasing by 5 per cent over the 25 year period. The average household size is projected to decrease from 2.02 in 2012 to 1.88 in 2037.

In Glasgow City, households headed by 60-74 year olds are projected to increase in number by 38 per cent, and those headed by the 75+ age group are projected to increase in number by 44 per cent between the years 2012 and 2037.
