Population

The 2016 population for Glasgow City is 615,070; an increase of 1.4 per cent from 606,340 in 2015. The population of Glasgow City accounts for 11.4 per cent of the total population of Scotland.

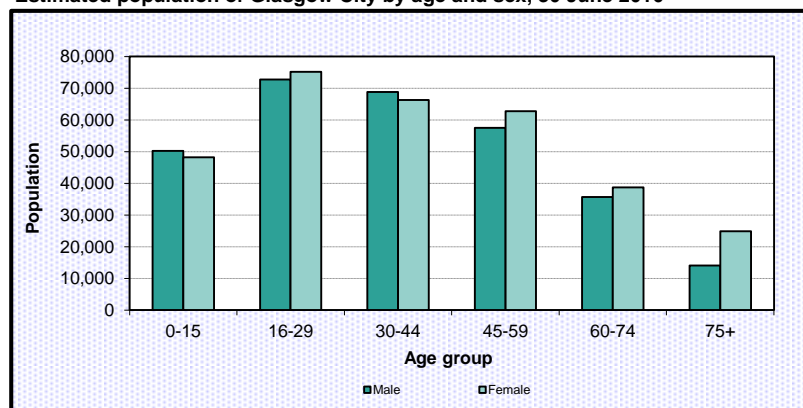
In Glasgow City, 24.0 per cent of the population are aged 16 to 29 years. This is larger than Scotland where 18.2 per cent are aged 16 to 29 years. Persons aged 60 and over make up 18.4 per cent of Glasgow City. This is smaller than Scotland where 24.4 per cent are aged 60 and over.

Since 1989, Glasgow City's total population has fallen overall. Scotland's population has risen over this period.

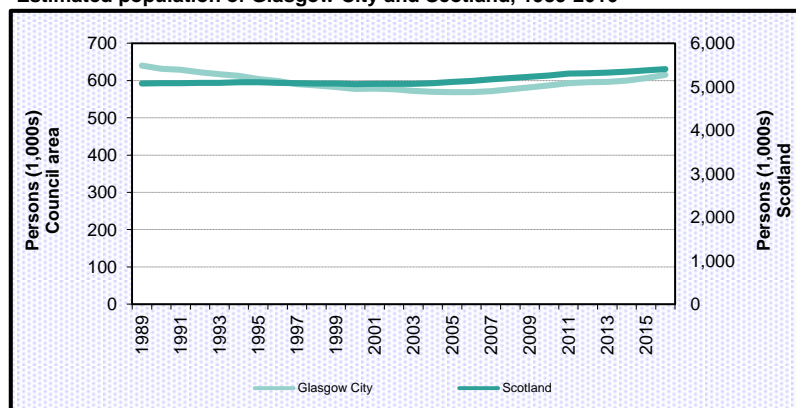

Births (calendar year)

Between 2014 and 2015 Glasgow City experienced a 5.1 per cent decrease in the number of births, dropping from 7,465 in 2014, to 7,086 in 2015. The number of births in Scotland fell by 2.9 per cent.

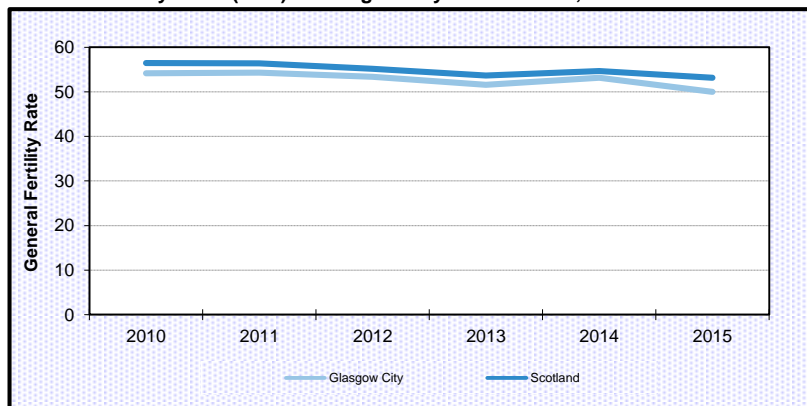
The most popular name given to boys born in Glasgow City in 2016 was Muhammad and the most popular name given to girls was Emily.

Fertility in Glasgow City decreased from 53.2 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2014, to 50.0 in 2015. For Scotland as a whole, the general fertility rate decreased from 54.7 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2014, to 53.2 in 2015.

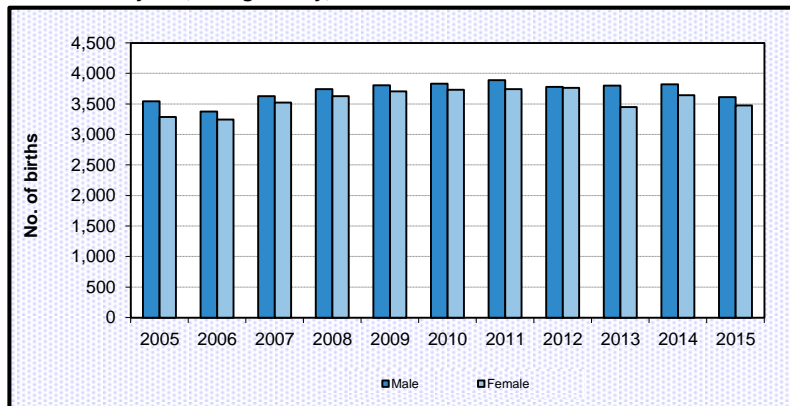

Live births by sex, Glasgow City, 2005-2015



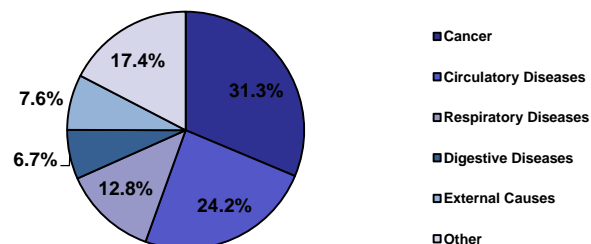
Deaths (calendar year)

The number of deaths in Glasgow City increased from 6,205 in 2014 to 6,515 in 2015. Over the period 2013 to 2015 the overall death rate was higher for males than for females. Compared to Scotland over the period 2013 to 2015, Glasgow City had a higher death rate. The main cause of death in Glasgow City was cancer, followed by circulatory disease.

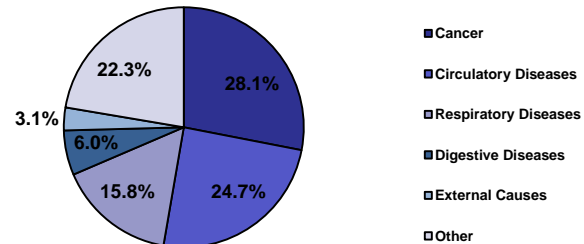

Migration

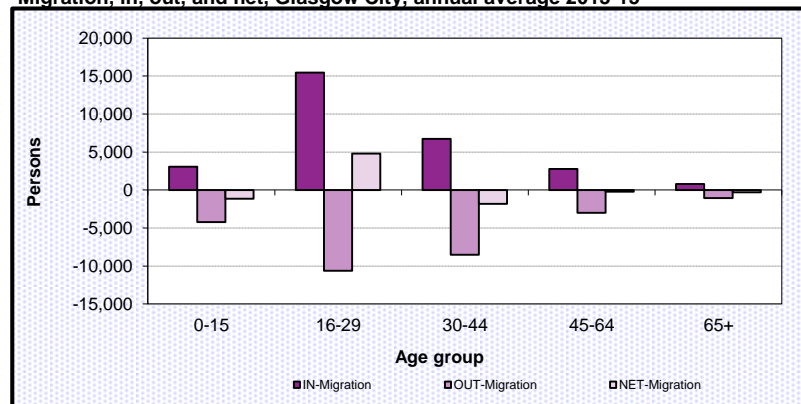
On average in 2013-15 there was a net inflow of 1,343 people into Glasgow City per year, meaning that more people entered Glasgow City (28,774 per year) than left (27,431 per year). The 16 to 29 year olds age group accounted for the largest group of in-migrants into Glasgow City. The largest group of out-migrants was also the 16 to 29 year olds.

Life Expectancy

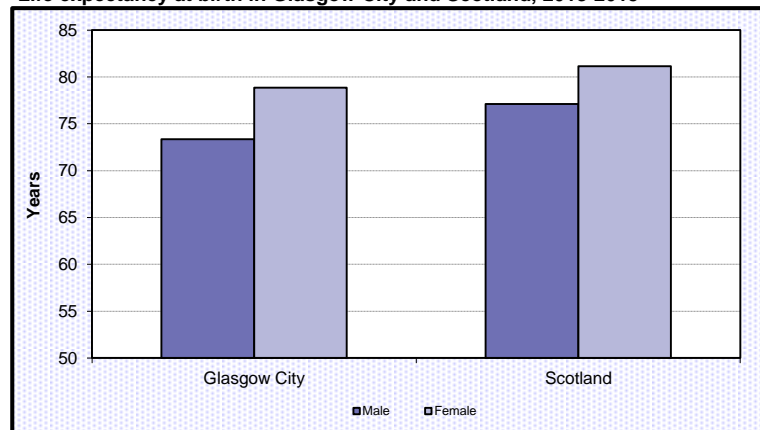
Female life expectancy at birth (78.8 years) is greater than male life expectancy (73.4 years), but both were lower than the Scottish average. Male life expectancy at birth in Glasgow City is improving more rapidly than female life expectancy.

In Glasgow City female life expectancy at age 65 (18.2 years) is greater than male life expectancy at age 65 (15.2 years).

Marriages & Civil Partnerships

There were 2,673 marriages in Glasgow City in 2015; an increase of 3.4 per cent from 2014.

In Glasgow City 52.6 per cent of people marrying in 2015 were aged 25-34. In Scotland as a whole 47.5 per cent of people marrying were in this age group.

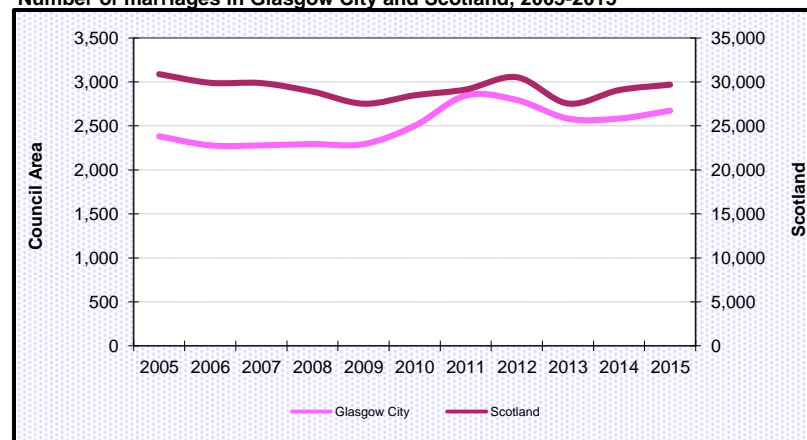
Since 2005 the number of marriages in Glasgow City has risen by 12.2 per cent.

Scotland has seen an increase during the same period of time.

Population Projections

By 2039 the population of Glasgow City is projected to be 637,609, an increase of 7.9 per cent compared to the population in 2014. The population of Scotland is projected to increase by 7.5 per cent between 2014 and 2039.

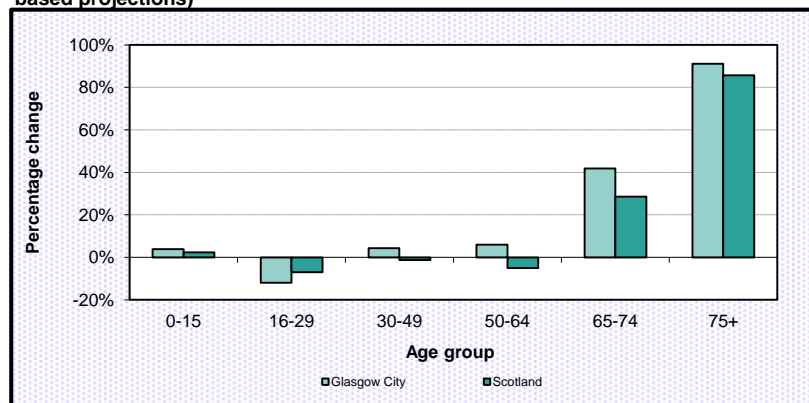
Over the 25 year period, the age group that is projected to increase the most in size in Glasgow City is the 75+ age group. This is the same as for Scotland as a whole.

The population aged under 16 in Glasgow City is projected to increase by 3.9 per cent over the 25 year period.

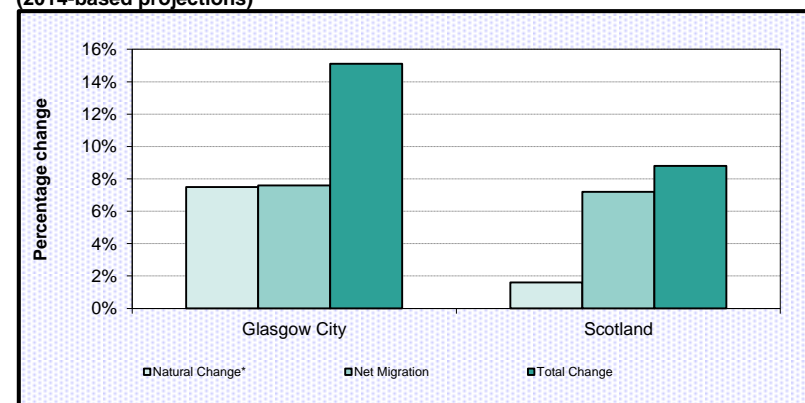

Households & Dwellings

The 2015 estimate of the number of households in Glasgow City is 290,694. This is a 0.9 per cent increase in the 2014 figure of 288,137, compared to a 0.6 per cent increase in Scotland as a whole. The proportion of these households receiving a single adult Council Tax discount is 45.3 per cent. For Scotland, this figure is 37.4 per cent.

With regards to the dwellings in Glasgow City, 97 per cent are occupied, 3 per cent are vacant and 0 per cent are second homes. The proportions of dwellings in Scotland which are vacant and second homes are 3.1 per cent and 1.1 per cent, respectively.

The 2015 estimate of the number of dwellings in Glasgow City is 304,013. This is an increase of 0.7 per cent from 2014 and compares to a 0.7 per cent increase across Scotland as a whole.

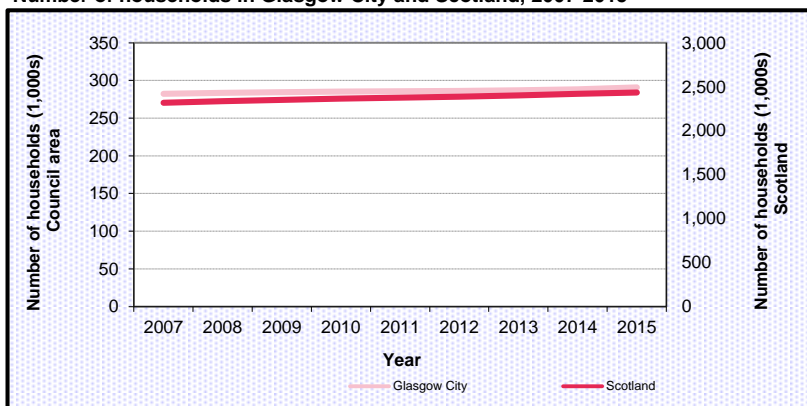

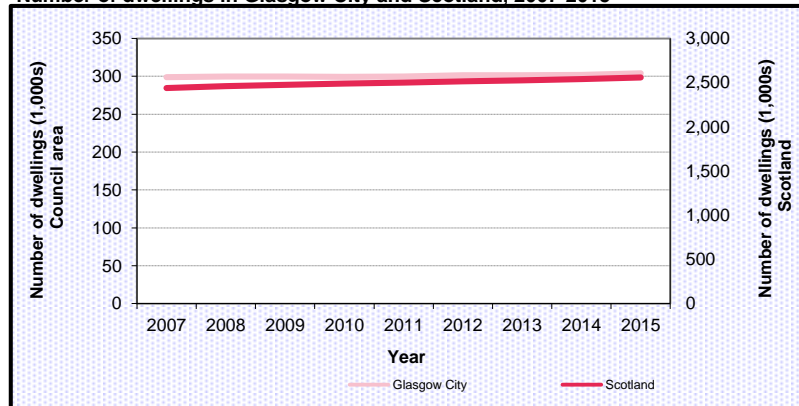

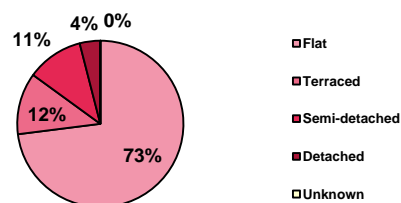
Number of households in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2007-2015



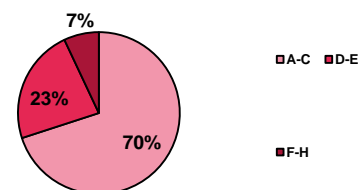
Number of dwellings in Glasgow City and Scotland, 2007-2015

Proportions of dwellings by Council Tax band in Glasgow City, 2015



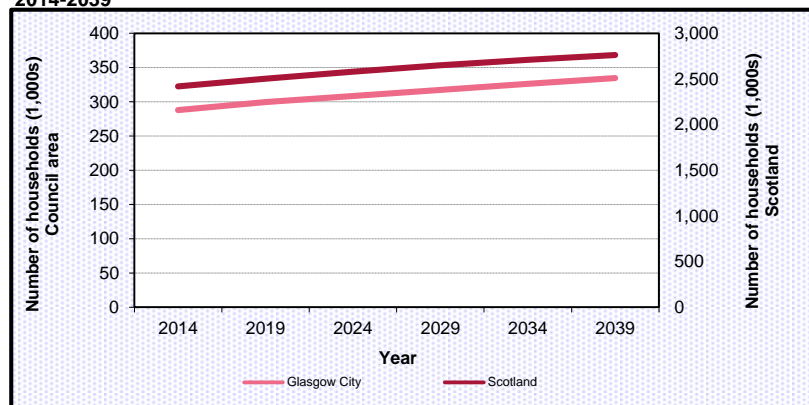
Household Projections

The total number of households in Glasgow City is projected to change from 288,137 in 2014 to 334,554 in 2039, which is an increase of 16 per cent. In Scotland as a whole, the projected number of households is set to increase by 14 per cent over the same 25 year period.

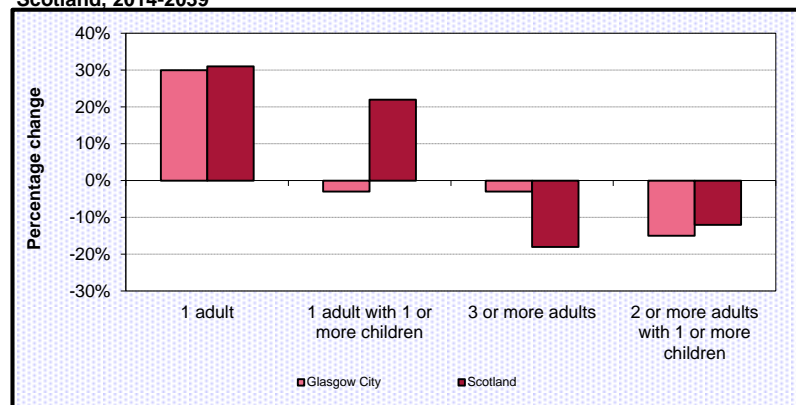
In Scotland, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 31 per cent over the 25 year period. In Glasgow City, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 30 per cent, and the number of larger households in Glasgow City is projected to fall, with the number of households of 2 or more adults with children decreasing by 15 per cent over the 25 year period. The average household size is projected to decrease from 2.03 in 2014 to 1.86 in 2039.

In Glasgow City, households headed by 60-74 year olds are projected to increase in number by 31 per cent, and those headed by the 75+ age group are projected to increase in number by 49 per cent between the years 2014 and 2039.
