Timeframe of data and timeliness	The estimates are based on the mortality probabilities indicated by the death records for the 3 years prior to the year of publication. For example, the 2008-2010 based estimates will be published in 2011.
Continuity of data	Life Expectancy estimates for Urban/Rural and deprivation areas are available back to 2004-2006, however urban/rural areas and deprivation areas have changed during this time. Life Expectancy estimates for Community Health Partnership areas are available back to 1996-98, and boundaries have not changed during this time.
Revisions statement	Life Expectancy in special areas are not subject to scheduled revision after the 2011 Census. Relevance and key uses of the statistics	Used in the monitoring and investigating health inequality issues within Scotland, and in setting public health targets.

Accuracy	<p>Life expectancy at birth, like most statistics, is an estimate which is subject to a margin of error. Completeness:	<p>Life Expectancy in special areas is presented in the form of an abridged life table, which means that estimates are available for grouped years instead of single year of age.</p>
Comparability	<p>Time-series comparisons are appropriate at Community Health Partnership level.</p> <p>The suitability of time-series comparisons for Urban/Rural and Deprivation areas is dependent upon the objective because the areas have changed over time.</p> <p>Please see page 5 of <a href="http://www.gro-scotland.gov.uk/files2/stats/life-expectancy-special-areas/07-09-le-special-areas.pdf">http://www.gro-scotland.gov.uk/files2/stats/life-expectancy-special-areas/07-09-le-special-areas.pdf</a></p> <p>Because of the differences between complete (single year of age) and abridged (grouped years) life tables, abridged life tables for Scotland are calculated and presented alongside the sub-national estimates for use as a comparator.</p>

Official Statistics designation	<p>Life Expectancy in special areas are official statistics (legacy designation, awaiting assessment by UK Statistics Authority)</p>
UK Statistics Authority Assessment	<p>Awaiting assessment by UK Statistics Authority.</p>
