Methodology:

The migration estimates are those associated with the mid-year population estimates for 2001/02 to the most recent year available.

Moves between Scotland and overseas are estimated using Long Term International Migration (LTIM) estimates which is based mainly on the International Passenger Survey (IPS). The estimates include migration of asylum seekers.

The tables also show moves between Scotland and the Rest of the UK which are based on the National Health Service Central Register (NHSCR).
