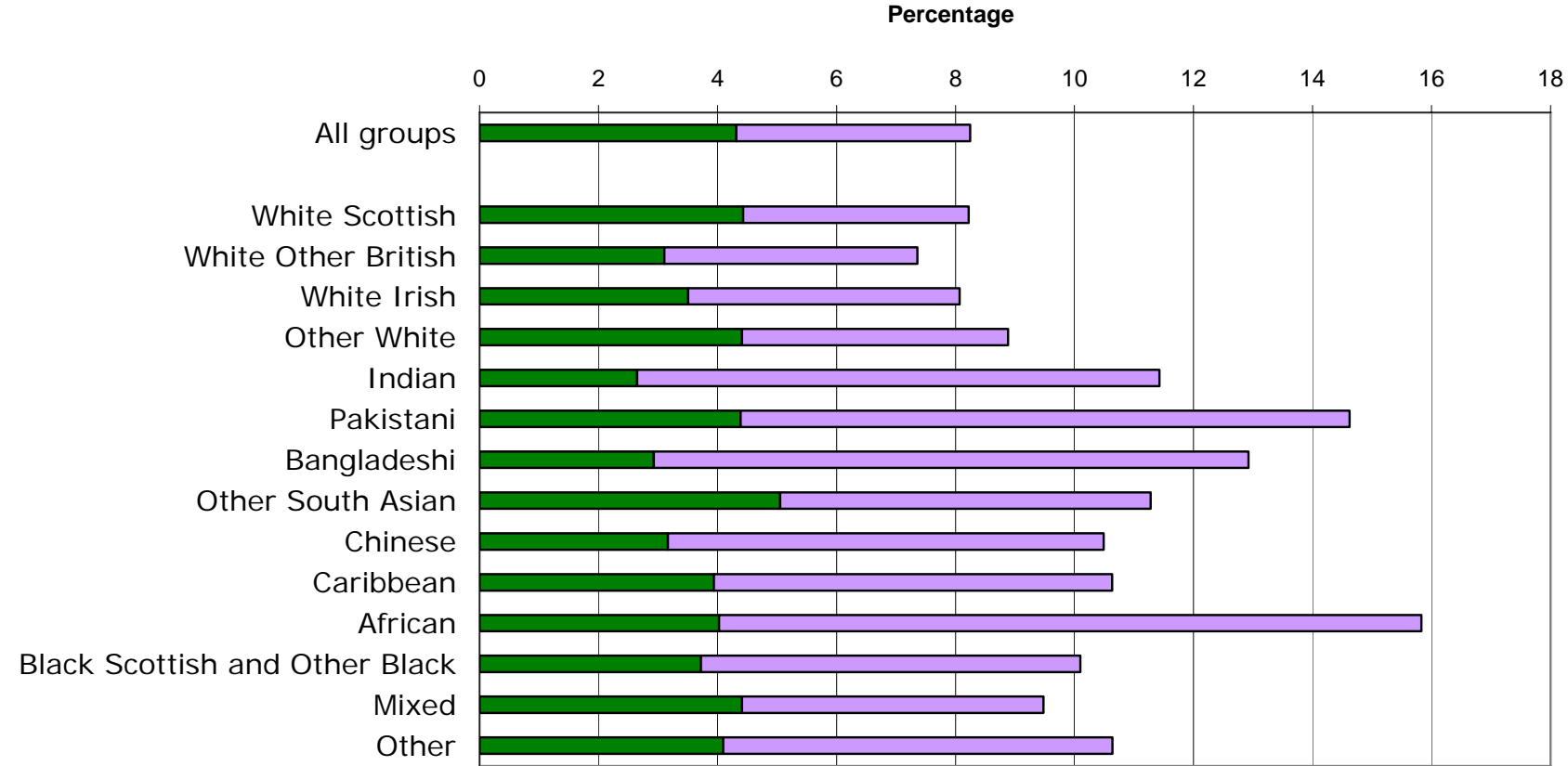

For 4.3 percent of records a useable response was not provided on a Census form and a value of ethnicity had to be imputed. The most populous category ('White Scottish') showed a slightly higher than average rate which allowed rates for most categories of ethnicity to be below average. An exception to this general rule was 'Other White', 'Pakistani', 'Other South Asian', and 'Mixed'.

The ONC process added 3.9 percent of the records in the final database. This proportion varied considerably among ethnic groups with relatively high values in 'African' (11.8 percent), 'Pakistani' (10.2 percent) and 'Bangladeshi' (10.0 percent). Only the most populous category ('White Scottish') had a lower than average proportion of persons imputed.
