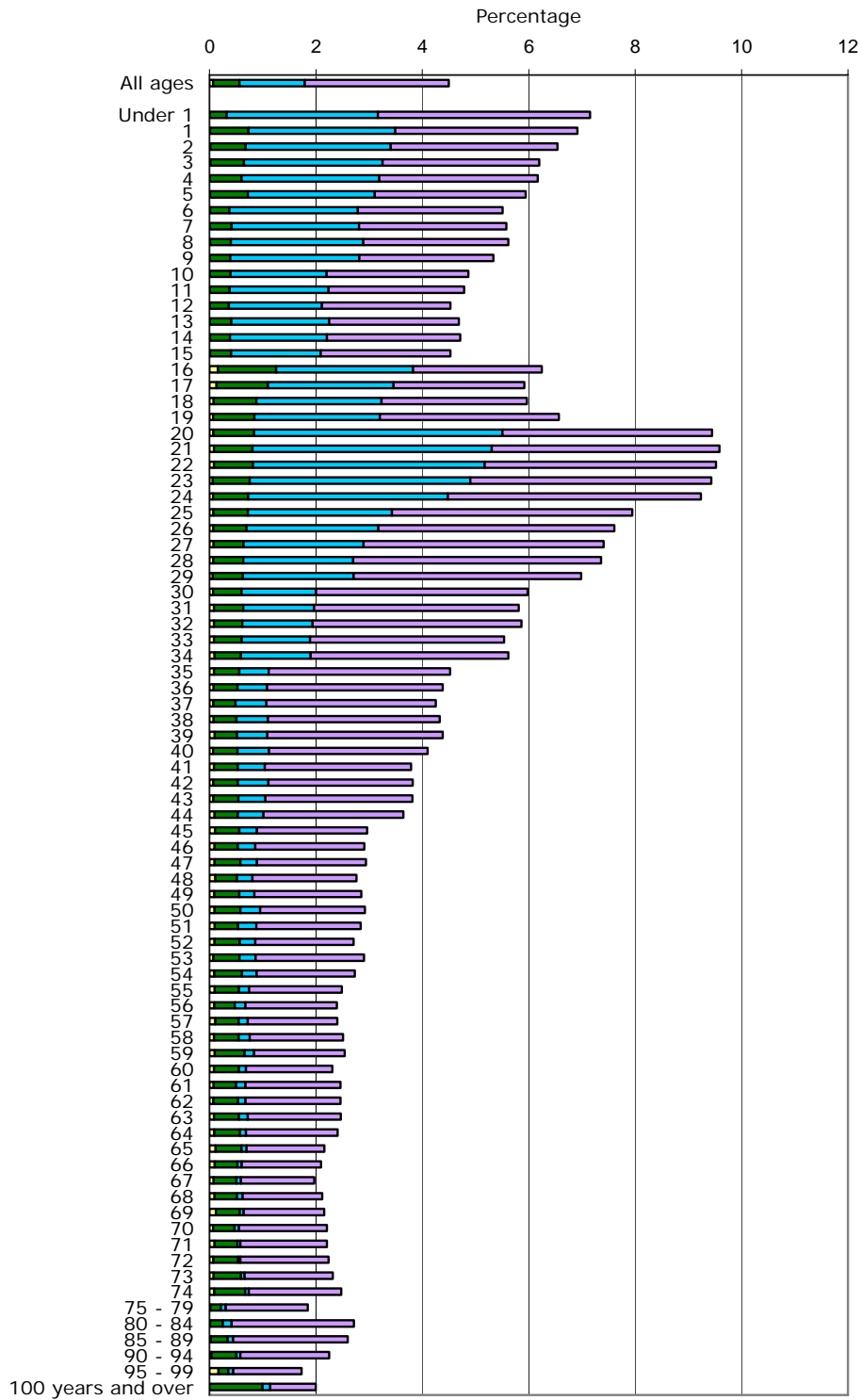

The Census variable age at Census day was obtained from the Census question Date of Birth.

There was a small proportion (0.07 percent) of persons for whom the age implied by the date of birth on the form was inconsistent with sufficient other items for age to be replaced by an imputed value. In most cases the other variables were in the realm of the labour market but the age was under 16. The imputed age would therefore be in the range 16 to 74, where the rate of such amendment was relatively high at around the 0.1 percent mark. There was also a high proportion of people aged 95 to 99 affected in this way, but the number involved was small.

There were a higher proportion of persons (0.5 percent) where an age had to be imputed because a date of birth had not been given. Apart from oddities due to small numbers, the highest rate of such imputation was for ages 16 to 24. Imputation was done by looking for donors that matched the record requiring imputation on the variables Activity Last Week, Marital status, Relationship to person 1. This choice of variables may have generated a relatively high number of 'young' donors.

Almost 4 percent of person records were imputed to account for imputation. This percentage divides between person records imputed into otherwise enumerated households and persons in households that were wholly imputed. The first of these categories of imputed persons were mainly given ages of 34 or less with a peak in the 20-24 age group; 4.3 percent of the total in this age group were persons imputed into enumerated households. Compared to the average for all ages (1.2 percent), there were also relatively high rates of 'person' imputation in the under 16s with the rate higher for the younger members of this group. Persons in wholly imputed households were more numerous than imputed persons in enumerated households, and were more evenly spread through the age groups. Nevertheless there was a peak among people in their twenties and, among the under 16s, in the youngest age group 0-4. There was also a lesser peak in the 'household' imputation rate for people in their eighties.
