Frequency	Annual - but this is the last publication at 2001 Data Zone level.
Timeframe of data and timeliness	The estimates refer to the publication as at 30 June each year and the Scottish Government Urban Rural Classification, version 2013-2014.
Continuity of data	Urban Rural Classification population estimates are available for each year from 2011 onwards.
Revisions statement	<p>Revisions and corrections to previously published statistics are dealt with in accordance with the Scottish Government Statistician Group corporate policy statement on revisions and corrections - a copy of which is available on the Scottish Government website.</p> <p>Revisions will also be carried out in accordance with the Revisions policy for population, migration and life events statistics available on the Office for National Statistics (ONS) website.</p>
Concepts and definitions	Background information on Urban Rural Classification is available on the Scottish Government website.
Relevance and key uses of the statistics	The Urban Rural Classification aids in developing the Scottish Government's understanding of the population issues facing urban, rural and remote Scotland to reflect this in mainstream policy development.

Accuracy	<p>2001 Data Zones have been assigned to the 6- and 8-fold classifications based upon the location of its population-weighted centroid. The figures are based on adding up data zone population estimates from the Small Area Population Estimates (SAPE).</p> <p>Further information can be found in the 'About this Publication' document within the latest Small Area Population Estimates publication on the National Records of Scotland (NRS) website.</p> <p>Although the populations are tabulated in units, this does not imply accuracy to that level. The data are presented in units for the convenience of users wishing to compile non-standard aggregations without encountering rounding problems.</p>
Completeness:	<p>The estimated population of an area includes all those usually resident there, whatever their nationality. Students are treated as being resident at their term-time address. Members of UK and non-UK armed forces stationed in Scotland are included; UK forces stationed outside Scotland are excluded. Short-term international migrants are excluded.</p>
Comparability	<p>The population of urban or rural areas in, for example 2011, may not be the same as the estimates for 2011 shown here. Instead, the estimates available here show how the population in the 2013-2014 Urban Rural classifications have changed over time.</p>
Accessibility	<p>It is the policy of the National Records of Scotland to make its website and products accessible according to published guidelines. More information is available in the Accessibility section of the NRS website.</p>
Coherence and clarity	<p>The statistics are provided in Excel format. They are designed to be consistent, and incorporate historical data where appropriate.</p> <p>Population Estimates by Urban Rural Classification are consistent with the mid-year and other estimates of the population in Scotland.</p>
Value type and unit of measure	<p>Counts of males and females by single year of age.</p>
Official Statistics designation	<p>These statistics are designated as National Statistics by the UK Statistics Authority. The Letter of Confirmation as National Statistics can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.</p>
UK Statistics Authority Assessment	<p>These statistics were assessed by UK Statistics Authority as part of the Small Area Population Estimates (SAPE) in July 2015. The report can be found within the UK Statistic Authority - Assessments section on the UKSA website.</p>
