Notes

This table shows the text descriptions that were each used for at least 10 such deaths. Apart from converting all the text to upper case, what was typed into the Death Registration system has not been edited in any way, because to do so could have taken a long time and would have been of little benefit.

The purpose of this table is to show the descriptions that were most often provided, and whether they are consistent with the ethnicity code that was recorded. For example, 'typos' and spelling mistakes have not been corrected and different variants have not been combined for example 'WHITE ENGLISH' does not include a case where 'WHITE, ENGLISH' (with a comma) was typed, 'GERMAN' does not include cases where 'GERMANY' was recorded and 'AMERICAN' does not include a case where 'AMERICAN CITIZEN' was typed.
